March 20, 2016 Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord

Dear Sisters and Brothers of Holy Family,

On this Palm Sunday we start the Holy Week, the most important week of the Liturgical Year in which we celebrate the great mysteries of Jesus' passion, death and resurrection in such a short time. We start a special journey today with the Lord; to the mount of Olives, upper room, Calvary, to the tomb. We meet lot of people, witness lot of events, think where we stand and with whom we stand; with the crowd, with Peter, with Judas, with pilate, with the other disciples, with the soldiers, with Simon, with the criminals, with Mary and the other women or with Jesus. How much we will change in this Holy Week?

Pope Francis in his General audience on March 27, 2013 spoke beautifully about this journey. "In Holy Week we live the crowning moment of this journey, of this plan of love that runs through the entire history of the relations between God and humanity. Jesus enters Jerusalem to take his last step with which he sums up the whole of his existence. He gives himself without reserve, he keeps nothing for himself, not even life. At the Last Supper, with his friends, he breaks the bread and passes the cup round "for us". The Son of God offers himself to us, he puts his Body and his Blood into our hands, so as to be with us always, to dwell among us. And in the Garden of Olives, and likewise in the trial before Pilate, he puts up no resistance, he gives himself; he is the suffering Servant, foretold by Isaiah, who empties himself, even unto death (cf. Is 53:12)." We remember and celebrate the total self giving of our Lord Jesus Christ for our salvation.

On March 4th we heard the shocking news of the massacre of 16 people including four Missionary Sisters of Charity in Yemen. They gave their lives following the example of our Lord Jesus serving the the poor, the needy, the elderly and abandoned. Let us reflect upon the mystery of Jesus' self giving and how do we live this total self giving in our daily lives.

Let us slow down a little bit in this very special week and take time to enter into the meaning of the great mysteries we celebrate. Find time to read and reflect on these mysteries in the scriptures, invite our friends and relatives to these celebrations, bring our children and grand children to our Live stations of the Cross on Good Friday. Let these mysteries touch and transform our lives so that we may live the mystery and become missionaries for the Kingdom of God. Have a grace filled Holy Week! Fr. Sunny.

20 de Marzo 2016 Domingo de Ramos

Queridos Hermanos y Hermanas de Holy Family,

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

What day is today? Ask most folks strolling home from church today and they will reply “Palm Sunday.” Not too long ago, today was known as the “Second Sunday of the Passion,” and in 1970 it was renamed “Passion Sunday.” This made some sense, since the procession recalling Christ’s entry into Jerusalem is usually only celebrated once in a parish on this day, but the Passion is proclaimed solemnly at every liturgy. In its most recent incarnation, the name for this day includes both aspects of the celebration: “Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord.” In the United States today, most worshipers are provided with palm branches, although in northern Europe pussy willows are favored, and in Italy olive branches are the norm.

When our calendar was reformed, the entire structure of the week to come was revised even as the traditional name, “Holy Week,” was retained. The major benefit of the restructuring of our calendar is to help us see that the Triduum, the great three days beginning at sunset this Thursday and extending until sunset on Easter Sunday, is at the heart of the Christian life.

Today, as you ponder the Lord’s Passion, you may consider your response to so great a gift. Centuries ago, good Christians vowed to go on pilgrimage to Jerusalem. Today, at least once in your lifetime, promise to participate faithfully in the liturgies. Now begins the Church’s annual baptismal retreat: don’t be left out!

A prayer for persecuted Christians... Heavenly Father, we ask that you would make us ever mindful of our brothers and sisters around the world who need us to stand with them as they suffer in your name. Teach us what it means to overcome by the blood of the Lamb and by the word of our testimony; we pray that we would not love our lives so much as to shrink from death. O Lord, hear our prayer.

Nothing quite says "Catholic" like a crucifix. They are attached to rosary beads, displayed in Catholic churches and homes and occasionally worn as jewelry. Catholics are often accused of "putting Jesus back on the cross," but nothing could be farther from the truth. When Catholics look at a crucifix, they see the God who became man and suffered, just as we do. **The following are common human sufferings that Jesus endured and how his suffering can help us to bear our own.**



During his agony in the garden at Gesthemane, Jesus' hand-picked friends fell asleep. All of them fled when he was arrested. His chosen leader of the Apostles, Peter, denied him three times; and only John, Mary Magdalene and his mother were courageous enough to keep him company at the foot of the cross.

When we have trouble with friends who are disloyal or distant, especially during trials, we can look at the crucifix and see that Jesus felt this same emotion. When we pray to him, we know that he understands exactly what we are enduring.

The human condition involves much physical suffering, some are quite severe. Whether you suffer from cancer, arthritis, or other assorted aches and pains, temporary or long-term, you can always turn to Jesus for understanding. Just looking at a crucifix means and the number of wounds inflicted on our Savior can give one a perspective of what it is to suffer physically. Pray to Jesus for healing or to be able to bear your suffering. He knows how it feels.

Jesus was forced to endure multiple humiliations. He was scourged, mocked, spat upon and stripped naked. The very same people who had sung his praises on Palm Sunday a few days earlier, were now crying out for his death. Just look at the crucifix—our God was treated as a common criminal and executed in the most painful and humiliating manner possible.

Yet, he turned this into the greatest good, rising from the dead and saving us from our sins, granting us the gift of eternal life. When you feel humiliated and discouraged, turn to Jesus in prayer, knowing he has empathy for your suffering.

Even the most faithful Christians feel as if God has forgotten them. When it seems as if our prayers are not being heard, we can turn to the crucifix and remember the words Jesus cried, "*My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?*" (Matthew 27:46). This was not a cry of despair—Jesus knew that God was still present; but he was in fact quoting the opening of Psalm 22, which begins in agony and ends in a burst of glory. Read the entire Psalm and realize that God is always with you and hears your every prayer. Yet, like Jesus, you may have to suffer before the prayer is answered.
