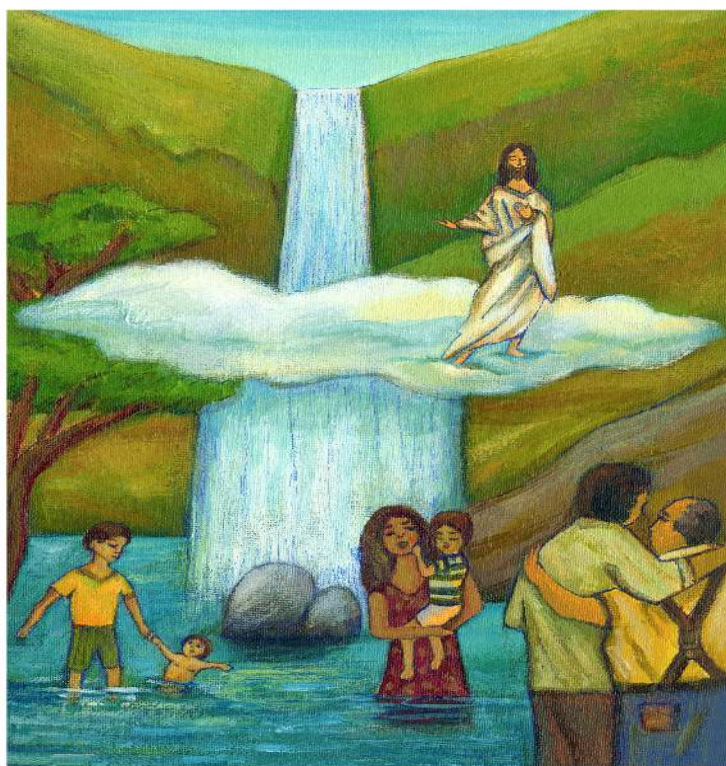

Love One Another

Today's Readings: Acts of the Apostles 10:25–26, 34–35, 44–48; Psalm 98:1, 2–3 3–4; 1 John 4:7–10; John 15:9–17. John's first letter reminds us once again, in these final days of the Easter season, that God sent his only Son to save us from death. The theme of love permeates today's readings. As is shown in these readings, love requires much more than warm and fuzzy feelings. In death, Christ shows us love. His suffering, death, and Resurrection remind us that love of God and for our neighbors does require, that we set aside those things that hinder us from knowing God. When we open ourselves to God, we are filled with love and love cannot be contained. God's love overflows and yearns to be shared. Because God's love is so great, it is easy for us to

sing the words to Psalm 98. Joined with all of creation, we joyfully sing of God's salvation.

In the Gospel, Jesus commands that we love as he loves, which means we must take the cross seriously. Jesus laid down his life so that we might have life. He went about healing the sick and listening to those on the margins. This is what Jesus teaches us about love, and if we are his followers, we must lay down our life for our neighbors and be willing to risk everything for God's Kingdom.

It is not always easy to love. This week, pray with the Gospel and be attentive to the command, "love one another." Consider hosting a meal for friends and family to show your love.

May 6, 2018 Sixth Sunday of Easter

Dear Sisters and Brothers of Holy Family,
I heard a lot of good news, when I came back from my three months' sabbatical. We had a great and uplifting Lent and Easter; reached our last Years' (2017) Diocesan Service Fund's goal: exceeded our Lenten Project goal etc. I am so glad and it clearly shows our love and dedication to our beloved church and its needs. I express my heartfelt thanks for your amazing expression of living our faith through our generous and sacrificial giving. Also, I want to thank all our Golf Tournament committee, sponsors, volunteers and all the participants for making it a success.

The month of May is specially dedicated to the Rosary of our blessed virgin Mary. The word "rosarium" means "Rose garden" "crown of roses" or "garland of roses" in Medieval Latin. Since each prayer in the rosary is considered a flower presented to Mary, this most popular Catholic devotion is called the Rosary.

As we are saying the Rosary, we are, in fact, in contact with two of the most basic prayers in our Christian tradition: The Lord's Prayer (the Our Father), and the Angelic Salutation (the Hail Mary). The first is fully rooted in the Scriptures, taught by Jesus Himself. The second is largely rooted in the Scriptures, its first half echoing the words of the Archangel Gabriel and of Elizabeth as each addressed Mary. The third prayer — the Glory be to the Father, ancient in its wording — surely reflects the unceasing prayer of adoration and praise found in the Book of Revelation.

During the recitation of the Rosary, we meditate on the saving mysteries of our Lord's life and the faithful witness of our Blessed Mother. Journeying through the Joyful, Luminous, Sorrowful and Glorious mysteries of the Rosary, we bring to mind our Lord's Incarnation, his public ministry, his passion and death, and his resurrection from the dead. The various events in the lives of Jesus and Mary on which we meditate during the Rosary are expressions of the one basic and foundational mystery of the Christian faith: The Paschal Mystery, that is, the suffering, death and resurrection of Jesus, in which Mary shared. Hence, by praying the Rosary, we come to live out the Paschal Mystery in our lives, thereby becoming authentic disciples of Jesus, people who really follow in his footsteps, dying with him so as to rise with him. We also ask for the prayers of our Blessed Mother, the exemplar of faith, who leads all believers to her Son.

When our Blessed Mother in her sixth apparition to the three children at Fatima, on the thirteenth of May, 1917, said, "Say the Rosary every day... Pray, pray a lot and offer sacrifices for sinners... I'm Our Lady of the Rosary." She advised them to say the rosary rightly, daily and devoutly for a holier life and for world peace. Let us fix a time for family Rosary every day and teach our children also this beautiful prayer.

6 de Mayo 2018 Sexto Domingo de Pascua

Queridos hermanos y hermanas de la Sagrada Familia,

Escuché muchas buenas noticias cuando volví de mis tres meses de sabático. Tuvimos una excelente cuaresma y Pascua; alcanzamos el objetivo del Fondo de Servicio Diocesano del pasado año (2017); excedimos nuestro objetivo del Proyecto Cuaresmal, etc. Estoy muy contento, esto muestra claramente nuestro amor y dedicación a nuestra querida iglesia y sus necesidades. Expreso mi más sincero agradecimiento por su asombrosa expresión de vivir nuestra fe a través de nuestra generosa donación y sacrificio. Además, quiero agradecer a nuestro comité del torneo de golf, los patrocinadores, los voluntarios y a todos los participantes por hacer del torneo un éxito.

El mes de mayo está especialmente dedicado al Rosario de nuestra Santísima Virgen María. En latín medieval, la palabra "rosarium" significa "jardín de rosas", "corona de rosas" o "guirnalda de rosas". Como cada oración en el rosario se considera una flor presentada a María, esta devoción católica popular se llama el Rosario.

Cuando estamos rezando el Rosario, estamos, de hecho, en contacto con dos de las oraciones más básicas de nuestra tradición cristiana: el Padrenuestro y la salutación del ángel (el Ave María). El primero está completamente enraizado en las Escrituras, enseñadas por Jesús mismo. El segundo está ampliamente arraigado en las Escrituras, en su primera mitad se hace eco de las palabras del Arcángel Gabriel y de Isabel cuando cada uno se dirige a María. La tercera oración, el Gloria al Padre, antiguo en sus palabras, seguramente refleja la oración incesante de adoración y alabanza que se encuentra en el Libro del Apocalipsis.

Durante la recitación del Rosario, meditamos en los misterios salvadores de la vida de nuestro Señor y en lo que vivió nuestra Santísima Madre. Viajando a través de los Misterios Gozosos, Luminosos, Dolorosos y Gloriosos del Rosario, recordamos la Encarnación de nuestro Señor, su ministerio público, su pasión y muerte, y su resurrección de entre los muertos. Los diversos acontecimientos en la vida de Jesús y María en los que meditamos durante el Rosario son expresiones del único misterio fundamental de la fe cristiana: el misterio pascual, es decir, el sufrimiento, la muerte y la resurrección de Jesús, en el que María compartió. Por lo tanto, al rezar el Rosario, llegamos a vivir el Misterio Pascual en nuestras vidas, convirtiéndonos en auténticos discípulos de Jesús, personas que realmente siguen sus pasos, muriendo con él para resucitar con él. También pedimos las oraciones de nuestra Santísima Madre, el ejemplo de la fe, que guía a todos los creyentes hacia su Hijo.

Cuando nuestra Santísima Madre en su sexta aparición a los tres niños en Fátima, el 13 de mayo de 1917, dijo: "Reza el Rosario todos los días ... Ora, ora mucho y ofrece sacrificios por los pecadores ... Soy Nuestra Señora del Rosario." Ella les aconsejó que rezaran el rosario correctamente, diariamente y devotamente para una vida más santa y por la paz del mundo. Fijemos un tiempo todos los días para El Rosario y enseñémosle a nuestros hijos también esta hermosa oración.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

In ancient Rome, the beautiful month of May was dedicated to the goddess Flora, the patroness of flowers and new life. May 1 was considered the beginning of abundant growth, and a day for public festivals aimed at expelling winter. Even after Christianity took hold, the customs of the pagan feast lingered behind. Long ago, there was a thirty-day devotion to Mary, sometimes called "Lady Month," which began on August 15. By the eighteenth century, the custom of assigning devotions to months of the year was developing. June, for example, was the month of the Sacred Heart, and October was for the Holy Rosary. Beginning with the Jesuit Order in Rome and spreading throughout the world, May has been celebrated as the month of Mary, the Blessed Mother, for more than two hundred years. That was a welcome remedy to some enduring pagan practices, such as maypole dancing and the crowning of the May Queen. Some historians say that in ancient times the May Queen was actually a human sacrifice. Devoting May to Mary is undoubtedly a better thing to do.

TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

Durante la Última Cena, Jesús dijo a sus apóstoles: "Yo soy la vid, ustedes son los sarmientos" (Juan 15:5). Jesús añade que los sarmientos (ramas) que permanecen en él, dan mucho fruto. Según la agricultura, la vid es una parra, es decir, una planta perenne de ramas frondosas.

Una parte importante de la vid son las hojas. Es obvio que una vid tiene hojas, pero Jesús no las menciona, prefiere enfocarse en los sarmientos. Las partes de la vid son las raíces, tronco, sarmientos, hojas, flores y fruto. Según esta división Jesús sería el tronco, pero él dice ser la vid completa. Esta es una imagen de la unidad que Jesús quiere entre sus seguidores. Recordemos que Jesús celebra la Última Cena con sus discípulos. La comunidad de discípulos unidos a Jesús formamos la vid. Los sarmientos o ramas conducen agua y minerales a las hojas, flores y frutos, y son útiles en tanto estén unidos a la vid. Lo mismo vale de los cristianos, discípulos de Jesús. Son ellos y ellas los que hacen presente y le dan vida a Jesús en el mundo de hoy.
