June 3, 2018 The Most Holy Body & Blood of Christ

Dear Sisters and Brothers of Holy Family,

“Do this in memory of me” (Luke 22, 19), Jesus told us at the last supper instituting Holy Eucharist, the sacrament of the body and blood of Jesus Christ. As we celebrate the feast of the body and blood of Jesus Christ, we thank God for this indescribable and amazing gift which nourishes us and leads us to eternal life.

Why do we go for mass on every Sunday? What do we celebrate every Sunday? “At the Last Supper, on the night when he was betrayed, our Savior instituted the Eucharistic sacrifice of his body and blood. He did this in order to perpetuate the sacrifice of the Cross throughout the centuries until he should come again, and in this way to entrust to his beloved Bride, the Church, a memorial of his death and resurrection: a sacrament of love, a sign of unity, a bond of charity, a paschal banquet ‘in which Christ is eaten, the heart is filled with grace, and a pledge of future glory is given to us’ (II Vatican Council, *Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy*, #47). In each mass, we represent and celebrate the sacrifice of Jesus on the cross, in the altar in an un-bloody manner. Jesus is offering his own body and blood to His Father for each and every one of us. We offer ourselves also with the offering of our Lord Jesus Christ. Our loving God accepts the offer and gifts us back with the body and blood, soul and divinity of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Let us thank God for sending us a new Deacon, Rev. Dn. Kevin Woodvine and his wife Eli Woodvine, all the way from Alaska!

Here is Dn. Kevin introducing himself: “*Life is a journey that sometimes requires us to make a physical move and sometimes it is more of an internal journey. My own journey began on a farm in Iowa. That is where my parents raised and taught the faith to me and my three brothers. My parents also owned a little country store that my brothers and I worked at from a young age. Twenty-three years ago, my son, who was three at the time, and I moved to Alaska. Little did I know that it would be both a physical and internal journey for me. With the help of the Holy Spirit and CatholicSingles.com, Eli came into our lives, and this October we will celebrate our twelfth wedding anniversary. This past May, I celebrated my third anniversary as a Permanent Deacon. We both are excited to be here in the greater Houston area. Priesthood Ordination: Called to work in God's vineyard ...On June 2nd Auxiliary Bishop George A. Sheltz ordained to the priesthood Robert David Hust, Matthew Gilbert Suniga, Jose Luis Gutierrez and Paul Anthony Folytn at the Co-Cathedral of the Sacred Heart in Houston. Over the next 4 weeks will introduce you to the new priests. Today we will feature Fr. Paul Anthony Folytn

Fr. Folytn was born in Houston, and attended St. Vincent de Paul Catholic School and St. Thomas High School. While he currently serves St. Bartholomew the Apostle in Katy, his home parish is Shrine of the True Cross in Dickinson. He also served summer assignments at St. Helen in Pearland, St. Jerome in Houston and did a pastoral year at St. Francis de Sales in Houston.



"My call has been a journey, comprised of people and events along the way which pointed me towards the priesthood," Deacon Folytn said. "The seeds of a priestly vocation were planted early in my life, and throughout high school, college, and working as a mechanical engineer, the call to 'something more' remained. Even though I continued to volunteer more and more for my parish, that feeling to 'something more' increased."

After meeting with the Office of Vocations to share his journey with the staff, he was soon accepted to begin studies for the priesthood at St. Mary's Seminary. Fr Folytn looks forward to *"serving the people of God through the Sacraments, prayer and especially in the celebration of Holy Mass."*

The members serve as the eyes and ears to our Pastor. They advise, suggest, or otherwise support the needs of our parishioners by reporting to the Pastor at Council meetings. Pastoral Council Members are friendly, visible and interested in making the parish alive in Christ. The Pastoral Council is the Pastor's Council, and all meetings are held in his presence on the 3rd Monday of each month from 7:30 pm to 9:00 pm in the Centennial Room. Membership is a three year commitment. The spiritual discernment process is facilitated by someone from the Archdiocese and includes a combination of prayer, scripture readings, questions and answers with all new nominees, as well as current PPC members, participating.

Nominations will be accepted from May 12 to May 26th. Any registered parishioner of Holy Family may nominate him/herself or someone else, with his/her permission, who would like to serve on the Pastoral Council. Below is the nomination form which can be dropped in the collection basket or the church office on or before May 26th.

We are looking to fill three positions in June. The requirements for Council Member Candidates are: That they be 18 years of age or older, a registered member of Holy Family Parish, in good standing with the church, attend the "Come and See" Information Session on June 9, and attend the Discernment Process on June 16th in the Centennial Room. Commissioning of new members will be on June 17th or June 24th. Please pray about this calling, and answer the question: "Is the Lord calling me to serve in this Ministry?"

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The origins of today's solemnity lie in thirteenth-century Belgium. In those days, people seldom received Holy Communion, and never from the chalice. A nun in a troubled convent, Juliana of Liège, devoted her life to stirring up love for the Eucharist, lobbying for a feast day to honor the Blessed Sacrament with Masses and processions.

Juliana may have been inspired by the Ascension Day processions in nearby Bruges. Crusaders brought a treasure home to Bruges from Constantinople in 1204: a reliquary said to contain a cloth from Joseph of Arimathea with which he had helped prepare the body of Jesus for burial. The stain on the cloth was said to be the holy blood itself, and so the people of Bruges built a great basilica to house the relic. Bruges became a great center of pilgrimage because of this treasure, and the procession of the Holy Blood is still one of the greatest festivals in Belgium today. The bishop carries the relic through the narrow streets, and the people wear medieval costumes and act out scenes from the Bible.

TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

Los cristianos creemos que Jesucristo esta físicamente presente en el pan y el vino consagrado durante la Misa. Esta creencia es tan antigua como nuestra Iglesia, pero fue solo en el siglo XIII que los cristianos comenzaron a venerar la presencia sacramentada de Jesús en la hostia. Fue durante esta época que nació la fiesta de Corpus Cristi o la actual celebración del Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo. Muchas comunidades cristianas celebran esta fiesta con procesiones y cantos en honor al Santísimo Sacramento del altar.

Recuerdo que en Texas el pueblo mexicano cantaba: "Bendito, bendito, bendito sea Dios, / los ángeles cantan y alaban a Dios (2x). Yo creo Dios mío que estas en el altar / oculto en la hostia ten vengo adorar (2x)". Este canto enfatiza la verdadera presencia de Jesús en el pan consagrado, pero sus cantores ignoran el hecho que nosotros también fuimos consagrados en el Bautismo; consagrados para "alter Christus" (otro Cristo) en el vecindario. En un mundo donde menos gente asiste a Misa el único Corpus Cristi que la mayoría de la gente secularizada verá es tu cuerpo. Ojalá podamos comportarnos como buenos testigos de la fe y que proclamemos "bendito, bendito" siempre y en todo lugar.
