Today might be a good day for us to make some promises as well. We can promise to stop kidding ourselves about our own tendencies to selfishness and sin. We can promise ourselves to believe—really believe—that while we are not sinless, we are forgiven. Is the Lord calling you to serve on the Parish Pastoral Council?

The PPC is made up of a group of dedicated parishioners that are voted in through a spiritual discernment process. The mission of the Pastoral Council is to bring the people of the parish and our neighbors closer to God through Worship, Service, Education, and Community.

The members serve as the eyes and ears to our Pastor. They advise, suggest, or otherwise support the needs of our parishioners by reporting to the Pastor at Council meetings. Pastoral Council Members are friendly, visible and interested in making the parish alive in Christ. The Pastoral Council is the Pastor's Council, and all meetings are held in his presence on the 3rd Monday of each month from 7:30 pm to 9:00 pm in the Centennial Room. Membership is a three year commitment. The spiritual discernment process is facilitated by someone from the Archdiocese and includes a combination of prayer, scripture readings, questions and answers with all new nominees, as well as current PPC members, participating.

Nominations will be accepted from May 12 to May 26th. Any registered parishioner of Holy Family may nominate him/herself or someone else, with his/her permission, who would like to serve on the Pastoral Council. Below is the nomination form which can be dropped in the collection basket or the church office on or before May 26th.

We are looking to fill three positions in June. The requirements for Council Member Candidates are: That they be 18 years of age or older, a registered member of Holy Family Parish, in good standing with the church, attend the "Come and See" Information Session on June 9, and attend the Discernment Process on June 16th in the Centennial Room. TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The cathedral is a treasure in a diocese and in our tradition. It is not simply a "big church," as some say; some parish churches are larger. What makes a cathedral is the presence of the chair, called a *cathedra* (Latin for seat) reserved for the bishop.

There are many instances in our country of a local church (diocese) outgrowing a cathedral. In Baltimore and St. Louis, the former cathedrals are historic treasures in the heart of the old city, but new and larger structures now function as the seat of the bishop.

When a bishop dies or retires, it is said that "the seat is vacant," and when the new bishop is installed, the central ritual is the moment when the decree of the Holy Father is read and the new bishop is escorted to the *cathedra*. No one but the bishop sits in the *cathedra* during a ritual, but in Los Angeles the *cathedra* in the Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels is accessible, and no one seems to mind when a visitor tries the *cathedra* out for the bishop's point of view.

Morir a sí mismo tiene sentido cristiano, sólo si es para trabajar unidos y en la misión de Cristo, la cual es salvación del mundo y construcción del Reino de Dios.
