Advent Begins Next Sunday, December 3rd....Advent celebration and traditions can vary from place to place, influenced by culture. However, some traditions have come to be common throughout the Catholic Church.

The **Advent wreath** is likely the most popular tradition, and wreaths are typically present in both the parish church and in the home. It is a more recent tradition, with the modern Advent wreath emerging in Germany and spreading throughout Europe and beyond in the 1930's. It is often circular, representing God's eternity, and it includes 4 candles - one for each Sunday of Advent. Many families have a wreath in the home, and will light the candles each Sunday and say Advent prayers together. A great guide for this practice is the book *Season of Light*.

The **Jesse Tree** is also a popular Advent tradition. A Jesse Tree, named for the father of David, is a tree that is decorated gradually throughout Advent with symbols or pictures of biblical persons associated with the gradual coming of the Messiah, Christ. This includes, among others, Noah, Abraham, Moses, and Joseph and Mary. The Jesse Tree tradition provides a wonderful teaching opportunity; it is a perfect way to teach and remind children about the preparatory nature of Advent.

Advent calendars are another popular tradition, although they most often follow the calendar month of December, not the four Sundays which can begin in November. While many popular Advent calendars use purely secular images, our gift shop is proud to offer a selection of several **Catholic themed Advent Calendars**.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Today we have a modern feast, less than a century old, and placed at the very end of the liturgical cycle of Sundays only in 1969. In 1925, the world was in a sorry state from the vantage point of Pope Pius XI. The winds of war had swept the map of Europe raw, and ancient Christian dynasties had fallen in Russia and Spain. Although the Great War had ended, wars were breaking out everywhere. Fascism was already in control in Italy, and Nazism was on the horizon for Germany. The disorder making its claim on the human race was, the pope felt, an insult to the Divine Order. Pius XI designated the last Sunday in October as a day of universal recognition of the kingship of Christ. Creating this feast was an act of bravery by the pope, who was standing up against idolatry of the state and the dehumanizing forces of the modern world, things that are not hard to detect in today's world as well. In 1969 it seemed fitting to move the feast to a place of honor at the end of the year, a way of summing up the whole movement of the liturgical year toward the perfection of the Kingdom of God. In recent decades, many Protestant churches have adopted this day from the new Roman calendar, so it is shared now with the Church of England, the Episcopal, Presbyterian, and Lutheran churches, and others.

TESOROS DE NUESTRA TRADICIÓN Hoy tenemos una fiesta moderna, con menos de un siglo de antigüedad, y situada al final del ciclo litúrgico de los domingos solo en 1969. En 1925, el mundo estaba en un estado lamentable desde el punto de vista del Papa Pío XI. Los vientos de guerra habían arrasado el mapa de Europa, y las antiguas dinastías cristianas habían caído en Rusia y España. Aunque la Gran Guerra había terminado, las guerras estallaban en todas partes. El fascismo ya estaba en control en Italia, y el nazismo estaba en el horizonte para Alemania. El desorden que reclamaba a la raza humana era, según el Papa, un insulto al Orden Divino. Pío XI designó el último domingo de octubre como un día de reconocimiento universal de la realeza de Cristo. La creación de esta fiesta fue un acto de valentía del Papa, que se oponía a la idolatría del estado y las fuerzas deshumanizantes del mundo moderno, cosas que no son difíciles de detectar en el mundo de hoy también. En 1969, parecía apropiado trasladar la fiesta a un lugar de honor al final del año, una forma de resumir todo el movimiento del año litúrgico hacia la perfección del Reino de Dios. En las últimas décadas, muchas iglesias protestantes han adoptado este día del nuevo calendario romano, por lo que ahora se comparte con la Iglesia de Inglaterra, las iglesias episcopales, presbiterianas y luteranas, entre otras.
