Why we pray to Mary and the Saints.

I was recently approached by a parishioner who said that he has been asked by a non-Catholic Christian why Catholics pray to Mary and the Saints. "Shouldn't we just pray directly to God?", asked the non-Catholic. In this reflection, I hope to show that prayer to Almighty God or to Mary and the Saints is not an "Either/Or" act but rather "Both/And."

Let's first consider what we profess to believe as Catholic Christians. First, through our baptism, we believe that we become children of God and part of the Body of Christ. We also believe, as we profess in the Apostles Creed, in "the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting." The communion of saints is the unity in Christ of all the redeemed, including those in heaven, those here on earth, and those who have died in friendship with God but are undergoing a final purification before entering heaven. Important is that Catholics understand that the thin veil between heaven and earth was made for distinction, but not for division. That is, we still have a relationship with those living in heaven and believe that heaven and earth meet during the celebration of Mass.

Thus, since we have that connection to those in heaven, when we pray to Mary or the saints, it is like asking a friend or family member to pray for us. And since saints in heaven, particularly Mary, are closer to Christ, who better to ask for prayers.

Of course, all of our love, praise, thanksgiving and devotion belong to our Heavenly Father and we need to spend time in personal prayer so that we come closer and closer to God. But having our Blessed Mother and the saints to pray and intercede for us is a great blessing for us in our struggle here on earth.

¿Por qué oramos a María y a los santos?

Recientemente, un feligrés se me acercó y me dijo que un cristiano no católico le había preguntado, ¿por qué los católicos oraban a María y a los santos. "¿No deberíamos simplemente orar directamente a Dios?", preguntó el no católico. En esta reflexión, espero mostrar que la oración a Dios Todopoderoso o a María y a los santos no es un acto de "uno u otro", sino más bien "ambos".

Primero, consideremos lo que profesamos creer como cristianos católicos. A través de nuestro bautismo, creemos que nos convertimos en hijos de Dios y en parte del Cuerpo de Cristo. También creemos, como profesamos en el Credo de los Apóstoles, en " la comunión de los santos, el perdón de los pecados, la resurrección de la carne y la vida eterna".

La comunión de los santos es la unidad en Cristo de todos los redimidos, incluyendo los que están en el cielo, los que están aquí en la tierra y los que han muerto en amistad con Dios pero que están experimentando una purificación final antes de entrar al cielo. Es importante que los católicos entiendan que el fino velo entre el cielo y la tierra se hizo para la distinción, pero no para la división. Es decir, todavía tenemos una relación con los que viven en el cielo y creemos que el cielo y la tierra se reúnen durante la celebración de la misa.

Por lo tanto, ya que tenemos esa conexión con los que están en el cielo, cuando oramos a María o a los santos, es como pedirle a un amigo o familiar que ore por nosotros. Y dado que los santos en el cielo, particularmente María, están más cerca de Cristo, quien mejor para que pida oraciones.

Por supuesto, todo nuestro amor, alabanza, acción de gracias y devoción pertenecen a nuestro Padre Celestial y debemos pasar un tiempo en oración personal para acercarnos más y más a Dios. Pero tener a nuestra Santísima Madre y a los santos para orar e interceder por nosotros es una gran bendición en nuestra lucha aquí en la tierra.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Frequent fliers today have many ways to accrue air miles, so one doesn't always have to endure long hours in cramped seats to earn free hours in cramped seats. In St. Paul's day, there were no such perks, nor would there have been any legal system for him to protest the shipwrecks he endured. He had other rewards in mind. The churches that he established in the catalogue of cities from today's first reading must have been very different from one another. Language, culture, customs, religious history, obstacles to community, social challenges, the places where they met, their clothing, their bread and wine, all distinct, particular to the area.

There were social customs as well: in a Christian household, the only place where a slave would be able to stand legally as an equal with the master would be at the table of the Lord, because at that table a new world of reconciliation was imaged. While Paul revered local customs, he was relentless about challenging the ways that people lived their Christian lives and how their worship reflected them. It is much the same today, as a global Catholic Church seeks to respect local customs and culture, allowing for differences in many things, yet always giving expression to the underlying presence of Christ, who binds us all together into his body.
