Thoughts from
our Deacon

We Are Never Too Old to Learn More About Our Catholic Faith.

How often have you been in a conversation with a non-Catholic when they have made a comment about the Catholic Church that you know to be wrong, but you do not know how to respond to them because it has been a long time since you were in CCE? Or maybe someone you know has taken a certain stance on a moral issue that you know differs from what you were taught to believe, but you don't know how to respond in a way that reflects the teachings of the Church. I would guess that many Catholics find themselves in a similar predicament. Why is that the case? I can't answer for all cases, but I suspect that the reason is that many have treated the Sacrament of Confirmation as a graduation from learning about the Catholic faith and have not taken the effort to learn more about the faith since the last time they were in a catechism/CCD/CCE class.

I want to let you know that you are never too old to learn more about your Catholic faith. In facilitating our Scripture study on the Eucharist this fall, I have learned a lot about how the Eucharist and Christ's sacrifice was prefigured in the Hebrew Scriptures, especially in the sacrifice of Isaac and in the miraculous provision of the Israelites in the desert after they left Egypt. In speaking with those who are taking the class, they are of the same opinion.

I know that many of you have conflicts with either work, school or your children's activities that make attending a Scripture study class or a class on Church teachings difficult. But, thanks to the support received from the Gift Shop, we have a subscription to FORMED, a Catholic Netflix-like Video-On-Demand and digital content service. It has a wealth of high-quality video and audio content on Scripture and the Catholic Church, which can be streamed at your convenience. They also have full-length movies and e-books. Nunca somos demasiado viejos para aprender más sobre nuestra fe católica.

¿Con qué frecuencia has estado en una conversación con un no católico cuando ha hecho un comentario sobre la Iglesia Católica de que sabes que está equivocado, pero no sabes cómo responderle porque ha pasado mucho tiempo desde que eras en CCE? O tal vez alguien que conoces ha tomado una cierta postura sobre un tema moral que sabes que difiere de lo que te enseñaron a creer, pero no sabes cómo responder de una manera que refleje las enseñanzas de la Iglesia. Supongo que muchos católicos se encuentran en una situación similar. ¿Por qué es ese el caso? No puedo responder para todos los casos, pero sospecho que la razón es que muchos han tratado el Sacramento de la Confirmación como una graduación de aprender sobre la fe católica y no se han esforzado por aprender más sobre la fe desde la última vez que estaban en una clase de catecismo / CCD / CCE.

Quiero hacerle saber que nunca es demasiado viejo para aprender más sobre su fe católica. Al facilitar nuestro estudio de las Escrituras sobre la Eucaristía este otoño, he aprendido mucho sobre cómo la Eucaristía y el sacrificio de Cristo se prefiguraron en las Escrituras hebreas, especialmente en el sacrificio de Isaac y en la provisión milagrosa de los israelitas en el desierto después de que se fueron Egipto. Al hablar con aquellos que están tomando la clase, son de la misma opinión.

Sé que muchos de ustedes tienen conflictos con el trabajo, la escuela o las actividades de sus hijos que dificultan asistir a una clase de estudio de las Escrituras o una clase sobre las enseñanzas de la Iglesia. Pero, gracias al apoyo recibido de la tienda de regalos, tenemos una suscripción a FORMED, un servicio de contenido digital y video bajo demanda católico similar a Netflix. Friday, November 1, All Saints Day is a Holy Day of Obligation. Masses will be celebrated in the Church at 8:45 am, 12:10 pm, 6:00 pm & 7:30 pm (Spanish).

All Saints Day, November 1, is a special feast day on which Catholics and some Protestant denominations celebrate all the saints, known and unknown. It is celebrated every year on November 1, and on the first Sunday in Pentecost in Eastern Orthodox churches.

While most saints have a particular feast day on the Catholic calendar, not all of those feast days are observed. Then there are those saints who haven't been canonized – those who are in Heaven, but whose sainthood is known only to God. These saints have no particular feast day.

The celebration arose out of the Christian tradition of celebrating the martyrdom of saints on the anniversary of their martyrdom. When martyrdoms increased during the persecutions of the late Roman Empire, local dioceses instituted a common feast day in order to ensure that all martyrs, known and unknown, were properly honored.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Friday's Solemnity of All Saints and Saturday's Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed fit well at the beginning of November. The liturgical readings of this final month in the Church year are keyed to the end of time and the fulfillment of Jesus' saving acts. Nowhere is this more fully celebrated than in Mexico, where November 2 is the "Day of the Dead." Missionaries moved an ancient Aztec festival from midsummer to November, linking the festival to Christian themes. Today, it is a time for remembering the dead and celebrating the continuity of life, principally by festive picnics in cemeteries. There are special foods and games, and people socialize with other families and tell favorite stories about their dear ones. The sweetness of life is honored by sugary desserts and treats. Flowers, music, lights, and feasting assure that the day is not at all morbid. Traditionally, the day begins with Mass, a procession to the cemetery, and a morning feast. Most families have a special dinner with the *pan de muerto*, or "bread of the dead." A toy skeleton is baked into the loaf, and the one who bites into it is considered lucky indeed. The dead are not feared, but deeply loved, and this joyful family feast points both to age-old customs and Resurrection faith.
